Complete the rest of the MoD1746 and other paperwork with your Resettlement Officer and send to ELC (if applicable).

If using ELC funding you shall receive a Claim Authorisation Number (CAN) which needs to be posted to us with the ELC Deposit payment for confirmation of attendance. If not using ELC funding a £200 deposit is payable at this stage.


We will then issue you an invoice for any funds you may be due and send you course joining instructions.



On leaving school, with few qualifications, I worked on an open cast coal mine, as trainee woodman and as a plant operator on the M25 before deciding to join the Royal Corps of Signals, British Army at the age of 23. I was 'encouraged' to choose this avenue due to my previous experience as a Radio Operator with the Green Howards cadets and Territorial Army based in Whitby and Scarborough.

The Royal Signals was certainly the right choice for me, although specialists in the communications arena, they also provide Command Support. In civilian terminology this can be translated into Service Support, Facilities Support or Business Solutions and it was in this environment that I found my niche. When I realised that I wanted to achieve the best position available to me in my 22 year career, I chose units, as far as possible, that would challenge and develop my knowledge and experience in this fast moving and diverse field. I eventually left following a Captain Quartermaster role having progressed through the ranks. During the latter stages of my military career I found the time to start an Open University Master of Business Administration course and during my resettlement I elected to attend the NEBOSH General Certificate and Fire Safety Management certificate along with the BHOS Asbestos Management course to prepare for a future career in Facilities Management. All of the latter 3 courses I took with Woodward as a package.

Woodward was recommended during a chance conversation and I cannot be grateful enough for this. Their enthusiasm, quality of instruction and ability to relate the information is first class. I was determined to pass the exams first time and therefore took advantage of the food and hotel deal and spent the evenings revising rather than socialising. Training To Job - Past Student Case Study: Gary Lawrie

Having served 22 years in the military to say I was scared of entering civvy street would be a slight understatement. Trying to find someone to take me on with my transferable skills was difficult and if I'm blunt the resettlement staff at my unit were good at pointing at the small jobs library and saying help yourself but not great at anything else. It was then I found your advert in the resettlement magazine and made my initial enquiry.

I explained over the phone my predicament to your booking clerk and she suggested that I had good solid environmental qualifications however to be an all rounder and make me more attractive to employers I needed to get a nationally recognised qualification in the three parts of QHS&E. It was explained to me what the NEBOSH Gen Cert was and how it was the

real foundation qualification to break into the industry, so I signed up for a course.

Now this is where I changed the usual habits of a life time when going on a course, normally you find out where the nearest bar is, where you can get a good Kebab and what place stays open the longest. On day one it was explained that Woodward had a 90+ % pass rate however we as students must play our part. I was given access to past NEBOSH questions, told how to study and shown a technique of how to attack my exam. I was exposed to laws and regulations I didn't even know existed, I took pages of notes in the first week in rough during the day and then in the evening copied them neatly into hardback A4 jotter (which I still have and is often borrowed), each evening I attempted a past question and Ray would have a quick scan jotting notes here and there the following morning during the coffee break.

To be honest it only started making sense in the second week, I found the past questions were getting quicker to finish, I found the regulations easier to understand and I started to enjoy the course.

The second and third weeks flew by and the exams were upon me, thanks to my self-imposed learning regime and my will power to study rather than visit the market street bars I found the exams challenging but doable. It was now a case of waiting for the results.

In the time it took to get my NEBOSH marked etc, I also went and got an ISO 9001 Lead Auditor Qualification, this depending on results would give me a Quality, Health and Safety plus my already in the bag Environmental Qualification.

Long story short I passed my NEBOSH, it was now time to apply for Jobs, I must have applied for well over 50 jobs via the internet following the advice of my resettlement










clerk avoiding agencies because they might charge me a fee (bad advice) I contacted one of the many agencies in Aberdeen and within a week had 3 interviews (all due to the fact the advice I was given by your staff was spot on I could carry out the duties of three people within one department).

Like a true Scotsman I went for the one that paid the most and was offered a position as an assistant to a QHSE advisor, within 2 months I was the Advisor looking after the QHSE on 10 North Sea platforms. I was able to carry out audits, advise on regulations and due to my environmental knowledge carryout these duties too, saving the company money not hiring in consultants. I stayed with that company for two years before being made an offer to join another drilling company based on the south side of Aberdeen.

If I hadn't phoned your company in February 2008 I wouldn't be where I am today, I still remain the only one within my department with qualifications in the three disciplines and can be sent offshore to carry out a number of management visits.

So thanks for the advice, the training, the exam passing technique (which I use for all exams now) and Rays many stories of when he was a lad. If you ever need anyone to stand up and say how crucial your training is to transferring to civvy street give me a shout.

PS. The first thing management asks me when we are thinking of hiring and if I know of anyone is "do they have their NEBOSH?".

NEBOSH National General Certificate

The **NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Safety and Health** is an examined core qualification for people who have part of their role at work involved in health and safety at work.

Managers, supervisors and staff from all types of organisations who need a broad understanding of health and safety issues. The certificate helps them manage risks effectively. Many people take the NEBOSH National General Certificate as a first step in a career in health and safety. It provides a valuable overview, and is a sound basis for further professional study.

Holders of the NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety are entitled to Associate Membership (AIOSH) of IOSH and also meet the academic requirements for Technician membership (TechIOSH) of the Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH) and Associate membership (AIIRSM) of the International Institute of Risk and Safety Management (IIRSM).

Course Content

The NEBOSH National General Certificate covers the main legal requirements for health and safety in the UK, identification and control of workplace hazards, and the practical application of this knowledge. No previous health and safety knowledge is required but candidates should note the assessment includes a requirement to write a short report.

Element 1: Foundations in Health and Safety

Element 2: Health and Safety Management Systems - Plan Element 3: Health and Safety Management Systems - Do Element 4: Health and Safety Management Systems - Check Element 5: Health and Safety Management Systems - Act

Unit NGC3: Health and Safety Practical Application

The course is presented as 2 x 1 week blocks, plus 2 days for the examinations. Units NGC1 and GC2 are taught units each assessed by a two-hour written examination. Each written examination consists of ten 'short-answer' questions and one 'long-answer' question. Unit NGC3 is a two-hour practical examination carried out by the candidate in their own workplace.

NEBOSH International General Certificate Conversion

The **NEBOSH International General Certificate in Occupational Safety and Health** is an examined core qualification for those who want to work internationally.

Managers, supervisors and employees throughout the world take the NEBOSH International General Certificate because it gives them the skills and know-how to fulfil their health and safety responsibilities in any country and in any kind of organisation.

Holders of the International General Certificate are entitled to Associate Membership (AIOSH) of the Institution of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH). The qualification also meets the academic requirements for Technical Membership (Tech IOSH) of IOSH.

Course Content

The NEBOSH National General Certificate Conversion Course covers the International Standards and Conventions for health and safety, to enable delegates who have attended the NEBOSH National General Certificate course to complete the NEBOSH International General Certificate course.

This course is designed for those service leavers who want to gain the NEBOSH International General Certificate in Occupational Safety and Health as a bolt on to their NEBOSH National General Certificate studies to maximise their career opportunities.

For just 2 additional days of study you can gain an additional NEBOSH qualification!

Completion of the NEBOSH National General Certificate in the last 5 years is a prerequisite for attending this International Conversion Course.

Unit IGC1: Management of Health and Safety

The course is presented as 1 x 2 day block, with the examination on the final day. Unit IGC1 is the taught unit assessed by a two-hour written examination. The written examination consists of ten 'short-answer' questions and one 'long-answer' question.

NEBOSH Fire Safety and Risk Management

The **NEBOSH National Certificate in Fire Safety and Risk Management** aims to build on the knowledge gained in the NEBOSH National General Certificate. It has been designed for managers, supervisors, employee representatives and others and aims to equip holders to contribute to the conduct and review of fire risk assessments and fire preventive and protective measures within most workplaces. It is therefore also suitable for people moving careers into fire safety adviser roles. It provides an appropriate breadth of underpinning knowledge for non-specialists in fire safety to enable them to discharge more effectively their organisational duties or functions with respect to workplace fire safety.

Holders of this qualification are entitled to Associate Membership (AIOSH) of the Institution of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH). Holders are also entitled to Technician Membership (TIFPO) of the Institute of Fire Prevention Officers (IFPO). It also meets the academic requirements for Technician Membership (Tech IOSH) of IOSH and Associate Membership (AMIFPO) of IFPO. Those with the relevant skills and experience may also apply to join the IFPO Fire Risk Assessors Register.

Course Content

The NEBOSH Certificate in Fire Safety and Risk Management course covers the management of fire safety including the relevant legal requirements. It also includes principles of fire and explosion, causes and prevention of fires, fire protection in buildings and ensuring the safety of people in the event of fire.

The content is designed to equip those studying it to undertake fire risk assessments in most, low risk workplaces. No previous health and safety or fire safety knowledge is required although it should be noted that the assessment includes a requirement to write a short report.

Unit FC2: Fire Safety Practical Application

The course is presented as a 1 week block. Unit FC1 is a taught unit assessed by one two-hour written examination which consists of ten 'short-answer' questions and one 'long-answer' question. Unit FC2 is assessed by one four-hour fire risk assessment carried out in the candidate's workplace within 14 days of sitting the examination for unit FC1. This course is for those candidates who are current NEBOSH NGC1 unit holders (passed within the last 5 years). Those who do not hold the NGC1 can instead study the 11 day fire course model and take papers NGC1, FC1 and FC2.

NEBOSH National Construction Certificate

The **NEBOSH National Certificate in Construction Safety and Health** aims to build on the knowledge gained in the NEBOSH National General Certificate. It is established as a leading award in construction health and safety. The course is aimed at Supervisors, Managers and Principle Designers within the construction industry who are required to ensure that activities under their control are undertaken safely. It is likely to prove useful for those concerned with the management of buildings who may need to ensure that contractors are working safely.

Holders of the NEBOSH National Certificate in Construction Safety and Health are entitled to Associate Membership (AIOSH) of IOSH. This qualification also meets the academic requirements for Technician membership (TechIOSH) of IOSH and Associate membership (AIIRSM) of the International Institute of Risk and Safety Management (IIRSM). It meets the headline entrance criteria requirements for Construction Safety Associate membership (AaPS) of the Association for Project Safety (APS). Holders are also eligible to apply for the CSCS Academically Qualified Person (AQP) yellow/white card.

Course Content

The NEBOSH Construction Certificate covers the main legal requirements relating to health and safety in UK construction work, identification and control of construction workplace hazards and the practical application of this knowledge.

No previous health and safety knowledge is required for the course, although it is advisable that candidates understand the basic practical aspects of the construction industry. It should also be noted that the examination includes a requirement to write a short report.

Unit NCC2: Construction Health and Safety Practical Application



Assessment:

Units NGC1 and NCC1 are taught units each assessed by a two-hour written examination. Each written examination consists of ten 'short-answer' questions and one 'long-answer' question.

Unit NCC2 is a two-hour practical examination carried out by the candidate in their own workplace.

Course Models:

This course is delivered as a 5 Day Course

This is a NEBOSH National Certificate in Construction Safety and Health "Bolt-on" course which covers the required content to convert from Unit GC2 to Unit NCC1.

Candidates will need to be current NEBOSH NGC1 and GC2 unit holders to attend the 5 Day course, or be studying it as part of their resettlement package, as it only covers the required content to convert from Unit GC2 to Unit NCC1, it does not deliver the full NCC1 syllabus content.

NEBOSH Certificate in Environmental Management

The **NEBOSH National Certificate in Environmental Management** is an examined core qualification designed to provide a sound foundation in environmental management knowledge. It is aimed at managers, supervisors and employees based in the UK, who have responsibility for managing environment issues, as part of their day to day duties.

The qualification is appropriate for professionals, managers and supervisors working in any industry with environmental impacts. In addition, those working in health and safety in other occupational settings, but who require additional environment-specific knowledge may also benefit from the course. This qualification is accepted by The Chartered Institution of Water & Environmental Management (CIWEM) to meet the requirements for Technician Membership (TechCIWEM). It also provides a sound basis for progression on to the NEBOSH National Diploma in Environmental management.

Course Content

The NEBOSH National Certificate in Environmental Management focuses on UK environmental laws and International management systems, such as ISO 14001. It covers the practical issues of managing environmental risk. The syllabus takes a risk management approach based on the best practice and international industry standards, including; Environmental Management Systems and Impact Assessments, Sources and use of energy and energy efficiency, Control of pollution, Planning for and dealing with environmental emergencies. No previous environmental knowledge is required although it should be noted that the assessment includes a requirement to write a short report.

Unit NEC2: Environmental Practical Application

The course is presented as 1×1 week block. Unit NEC1 is a taught unit assessed by a two-hour written examination. Unit NEC2 requires the candidate to carry out an environmental review of a workplace or organisation and produce a justified action plan to improve performance. This practical application must normally be completed and returned to the Course Provider within 14 days of the written examination.

NEBOSH National Diploma

All occupational health and safety practitioners (OHASPs) need to have a common core of knowledge in order to practise effectively. The NEBOSH National Diploma in Occupational Health and Safety aims to provide the knowledge and understanding that underpins competent performance as an OHASP. Holders of the NEBOSH National Diploma in Occupational Health and Safety may use the designatory letters "DipNEBOSH" after their name.

The NEBOSH National Diploma in Occupational Health and Safety is the qualification for aspiring health and safety professionals, building directly upon the foundation of knowledge provided by the NEBOSH National General Certificate. It is designed to provide students with the expertise required to undertake a career as a safety and health practitioner and also provides a sound basis for progression to postgraduate study.

The qualification meets the academic requirements to apply for Graduate Membership (Grad IOSH) of Institution of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH). This is the first step to becoming a Chartered Health and Safety Practitioner as a Chartered Member of IOSH (CMIOSH). It also accepted by the International Institute of Risk and Safety Management (IIRSM) as meeting the academic requirements for full membership (MIIRSM).

Holders of the NEBOSH National Diploma and the NEBOSH National Certificate in Construction Health and Safety meet the headline entrance criteria requirements for Registered Construction Safety Practitioner (RMaPS) membership of the Association for Project Safety (APS). Holders are also eligible to apply for the CSCS Academically Qualified Person (AQP) yellow/white card.

Units A, B and C are each assessed by one three-hour written examination. All questions are compulsory. Unit DNI is assessed by a written assignment of approximately 8,000 words, designed to test knowledge across the syllabus by assessing application of health and safety theory and practice (Unit DNI). Students may choose to take individual units in any order over a five year period and will be awarded a unit certificate for each unit passed.

The NEBOSH National General Certificate [or comparable QCF level 3 award] is the suggested prerequisite qualification for the NEBOSH National Diploma Course. However there are no formal entry requirements set by NEBOSH and those students without the NEBOSH National General Certificate will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
